- Ad hoc meeting in response to conference changes amid COVID-19 change
- Hotel Madison had been keeping us to our contract, putting us 40K out for 2020, but recently recently responded with postponing a year as an option so long as:
 - Hotel Madison keeps the original 12k deposit but charges an additional, non-refundable \$5k (date change fee) for a total of a 17k deposit for 2021
 - this is not a problem should 2021 happen, as it will go towards the conference cost
 - this puts us out 17k should 2021 not happen, because it's non-refundable
